



Halloween Corner

Resources for your Primary class

This is an idea for Early Learners (6 – 8 years old).

1. Show pictures of typical Halloween things – there are a lot of webs on Internet with pictures to colour. e.g. bat, pumpkin, ghost, skeleton, witch, broomstick, spider, night, candle, moon, black cat etc.
2. Play card games to practise the vocabulary e.g. Write the words on separate cards and make sets of pictures for the students. Play in pairs or groups. Shuffle the word cards. Turn one over and call out the word (even better if a student does this). The first group to show the right card (or bring it to the teacher) gets the point.
3. Show the picture of a haunted house (try and enlarge to A3 for the teacher's example). Photocopy the house onto A3 paper but A4 size on one side. Cut the windows and door along the dotted lines beforehand and fold them back. Fold the A3 sheet in half and stick the house onto the white sheet behind.
4. Ask the kids to draw something behind the windows and door, then close them.
5. Show their house to others in the class. Try and guess what's there. Open the windows and door to see if the guesses were correct.
